Tinsley Community Organisations fight for Survival

Tinsley Forum, Tinsley Green Nursery and Tinsley Advice Service are currently fighting for survival. Victims of the Governments draconian cuts in funding. Below each organisation explains what's happening.

Tinsley Forum was established in 1984 and has worked since that time to offer the local community a variety of essential services aimed at improving the overall health, life skills, social and employability prospects of local people and worked towards tackling local issues and building a stronger community. Over the past 11 years Tinsley Forum has been successful in attracting funding to secure a 99 year lease on the Tinsley One Stop Shop, finance its renovation from a disused Church to a community building and pay for staff wages and running costs. We currently have funding to keep the One Stop Shop open and staffed until July

this year, after which unless further funding is found the services Tinsley Forum offer to the community will cease and the Tinsley One Stop Shop will close. The closure of the One Stop Shop will have a knock on effect to Sheffield College, Tinsley Advice Service and all other users who would at that time have to find suitable alternative premises to run their services from or find the additional finances for the building to run. As it currently stands Tinsley Forum need to find an additional £50,000 from July in order to keep the building running and core staff in place within this financial year.

The nursery in Tinsley Green is facing large cuts to its funding in the coming year. The Council has informed the nursery that it will cut 25% from the funding this year and 100% in 2012. Tinsley Parents and Children's Consortium (TPCC), the charity that delivers the childcare for up to 60 children, report that the cuts will inevitably lead to job losses and a

reduction in the services for local parents. The nursery is the only provision in the area for working parents and parents who want to learn English or train for work and as over 100 children attend the nursery each week any loss in service will have a serious effect on many local families. If these cuts are imposed the nursery would also have to reduce the support it provides for families with children with additional needs and disabilities.

In addition to these severe cuts to the nursery provision the Children's Centre is also facing a 15% cut in funding for the other services that support local families. The combination of these cuts to frontline services will impact on the families most in need of support and could leave working families with young children with no local option.

TPCC has informed the Council of the impact of the cuts and has asked that they reconsider before vital local services are lost. To find out more about the cuts or to find our what you can do to support these local services please call into the nursery office at Tinsley Green.

Tinsley Advice Service (TAS) have operated since 1984, we support the local community and offer a city wide service for

people and families who need information, advice and support. We are currently suffering from severe financial difficulties which could bring about a potential closure of our service. TAS is situated on the community doorstep in the Tinsley One Stop Shop with very easy to access for the local community. We hold the Legal Service Commission Awards in Welfare Rights and our work around Immigration, Nationality and Debts has contributed to us running a service that works with over 4000 clients and deals with over 6,000 enquiries per year. TAS generate between £250,000 and £300,000 per year into households in the local community for clients who come to us for help with benefit problems and debt advice. Currently TAS gets just £33k a year from the City Council with all further funding found through fund raising of which we have already raised over £1.5m in 20 years to pay for Advice and Reception staff and our running costs but this is getting harder and harder to do. If TAS closes, local residents will have to seek support from other services which are out of the local area. Residents will face transportation problems, language barriers and won't receive home visits. Currently the Advice Service needs to find another £80k to keep running until March 2012.

Tinsley Forum tackle Government on Air Pollution from Motorway

insley Forum working with Clive Betts MP have been trying to get the Government department (DEFRA) responsible for air quality and the Highways Agency who manage the M1 Motorway to give a commitment that they will ensure that the levels of Nitrogen Dioxide air pollution from the M1 do not break European limit value laws. These laws are aimed at protecting peoples health.

The Government is currently trying to move back the start date for this law until 2015. We have been particularly concerned about the close proximity of local schools to the

In a recent email The Highways Agency agreed that:

"Any required action to meet limit values (the law) to be taken by the Highways Agency will be discussed and agreed with DEFRA prior to May 2011 and detailed in the plans submitted for consultation by DEFRA. We are currently working with DEFRA to identify the scale and nature of any necessary interventions in respect of the strategic road

network. Therefore, we are not yet in a position to identify the specific measures which may be considered to ensure DEFRA responsibilities in respect of EU limit values are effectively delivered.

Tinsley Forum and East End Quality of Life Initiative have been told by Lord Henley the Parliamentary Under Secretary at the Department for Environment Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA) that they will be involved in the consultation exercise.

Green Electricity from the River Don moves closer

Sheffield Renewables, a local social enterprise, has applied for planning permission for a hydro electric scheme on the River Don at the Jordan Dam weir at Blackburn Meadows. The project will generate enough green electricity for around 80 homes, contributing to city wide efforts to tackle climate change. It has also been designed with the river's fish in mind, with a fish ladder and fish friendly hydro technology.

Sheffield Renewables is led by volunteers and is run on a not-for profit basis so surplus revenue will be reinvested to support other local green initiatives. Sheffield residents will be able to invest in the schemes by buying shares, and so help to make the city greener whilst earning a modest rate of interest.

Alongside the Jordan Dam hydro scheme, Sheffield Renewables is hoping to support work by South Yorkshire Energy Centre to help Tinsley residents make their homes warmer and more energy efficient.

Tinsley School raises Trout for **Sheffield Rivers**

insley schoolchildren are raising a crucial species of trout for release into the River Don.

They are taking part in the Windows to Waterway Wildlife project which encourages pupils to learn about river wildlife. The project, run by environmental charity Groundwork Sheffield, also aims to boost Brown Trout levels which are vital to the rivers' ecosystems. Last month fish tanks containing up to 150 tiny Brown Trout were installed in Tinsley Nursery Infant School, as well as 4 other schools in Northern Sheffield, and will remain in the classroom The pupils have been introduced to the fish by Waterways Education Officer, Matthew Ross. Mr Ross said: "The pupils will watch the fish grow in a calm, secure, clean environment and help to care for them. When the trout grow to 7-10cm long they will be returned to the river. At this size the trout will have a better chance of survival as they will be less vulnerable to predators and varying water temperatures. Fully grown trout can reach 50cm in length." Brown Trout are an important 'keystone' species in rivers, providing food for species such as Pike.

Groundwork Sheffield is running education sessions alongside the project, and the fish will be released into the river in late March. Windows to Waterway Wildlife is funded by the National Lottery through Awards for All (www.awardsforall.org.uk) contact: Matthew Ross: 07807 918 366.
